*“Lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all...the gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ” (Ephesians 4:1-6, 11-12).*

As summer draws near, change is all around us: new flowers and plants springing up, warmer air, the end of the school year, and the beginning of new schedules and routines. Everywhere, we are reminded that change is a part of all living things.

There are changes at Trinity, too. Our kids and youth will be especially active this summer, making memories and growing in faith at Vacation Bible School (June 13-17), Sky Ranch programs (in June, and July 31-Aug. 5), and the high school mission trip to Vancouver, B.C. (July 22-30). Each of these new, challenging experiences can change our young members' lives forever! Please pray that God will encounter them, stretch them, and touch their lives this summer.

In June and July, our search team will be conducting interviews with candidates to determine whom God is calling to lead Trinity's children's, youth and household ministry. Trinity received almost twenty applications from all over the U.S.! God has blessed us, and we ask your prayers for the Holy Spirit's guidance as we move forward. We hope to have our new children's, youth and household minister on staff by the end of the summer.

We have also said goodbye to Linda Bleich, our former office manager, and in this time of transition, we have been blessed by the leadership of Trinity members who have stepped in for an interim period to keep Trinity's office going strong. During June and July, pastors will be working to determine the best staffing options for the office going forward.

In the church, as in life, some change is planned, some unplanned. Change is normal and healthy for congregations—but it can still be very difficult. We may be unsure about it, asking, “Why?” and especially, “What now?” Some of you may remember, from our Pastor and People meetings, our discussion of Matthew 14 and the disciple Peter: standing uneasily on the water, outside the boat and surrounded by winds, trying to follow Jesus. Uncertainty about the future can be like a strong wind!

But Peter was not alone on the water. And even though it can be hard to see, we know this: God promises to be in the midst of

change, working through it to bring new life and hope and possibility. As your pastors, we want to encourage all of you to remember what doesn't change: God has forgiven, chosen and claimed us as beloved children, as beloved church. We have a calling: to equip the saints (that's all God's people!) for the work of ministry and to build up the body of Christ.

In order to do that, Trinity needs you! We need you here, a part of our community, so that you may be strengthened and encouraged to share your God-given gifts as God has called you. We need you, because as a body of many members with different stories, perspectives and concerns, we are still one body with one Lord, one faith, one baptism. Trinity needs a congregation willing to take steps forward, trusting in God's guidance and promises, bearing with one another in love, and remembering to act and speak with one another in ways that promote unity and peace.

Over these next few months, as warm weather and vacation plans beckon, remember that the ministry of your congregation continues, and so does your calling from God to serve in ways that bring help, healing and wholeness to you and to others. Our prayer for you will be that your faith and joy will flower and grow this summer and always, in the name of the One who gives all life: Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

## Stewardship Matters

"We offer with joy and thanksgiving what you have first given us, ourselves, our time and our possessions, signs of your gracious love. Receive them for the sake of him who offered himself for us."

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. Cast me not away from your presence and take not your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and uphold me with your free spirit."

We've said and sung these words so many times in worship that, perhaps, we have forgotten to pay attention to what they are saying. They are the words used as a response to our offerings reminding us to have joyful hearts because so much has been given to us.

Is your heart joyful? Is it joy-filled? The first offertory prayer reminds me to ask myself, "am I living a thoughtful, intentional, gentle life?" Time is valuable and can never be recovered, so what do I spend my time doing? Are my actions showing the world what's in my heart? Then, my possessions; what do I have and how is it reflecting what's in my heart? If my heart is filled with the joy of salvation, how can any of these three things be out of balance?

Being out of balance is easy in today's world. Bad news surrounds us. We feel pressed for time and pinched for cash. Stewardship matters and this is a call to give, but not necessarily for cash. It is a call for us to give ourselves that long look in the mirror guided by the words of the offertory prayers: ourselves, our time and our possessions, the joy of your salvation and freely-given spirit. When we reflect on these things, we discover which of them best suits our ability to give and we begin to brightly reflect the vision of God's kingdom all around us.

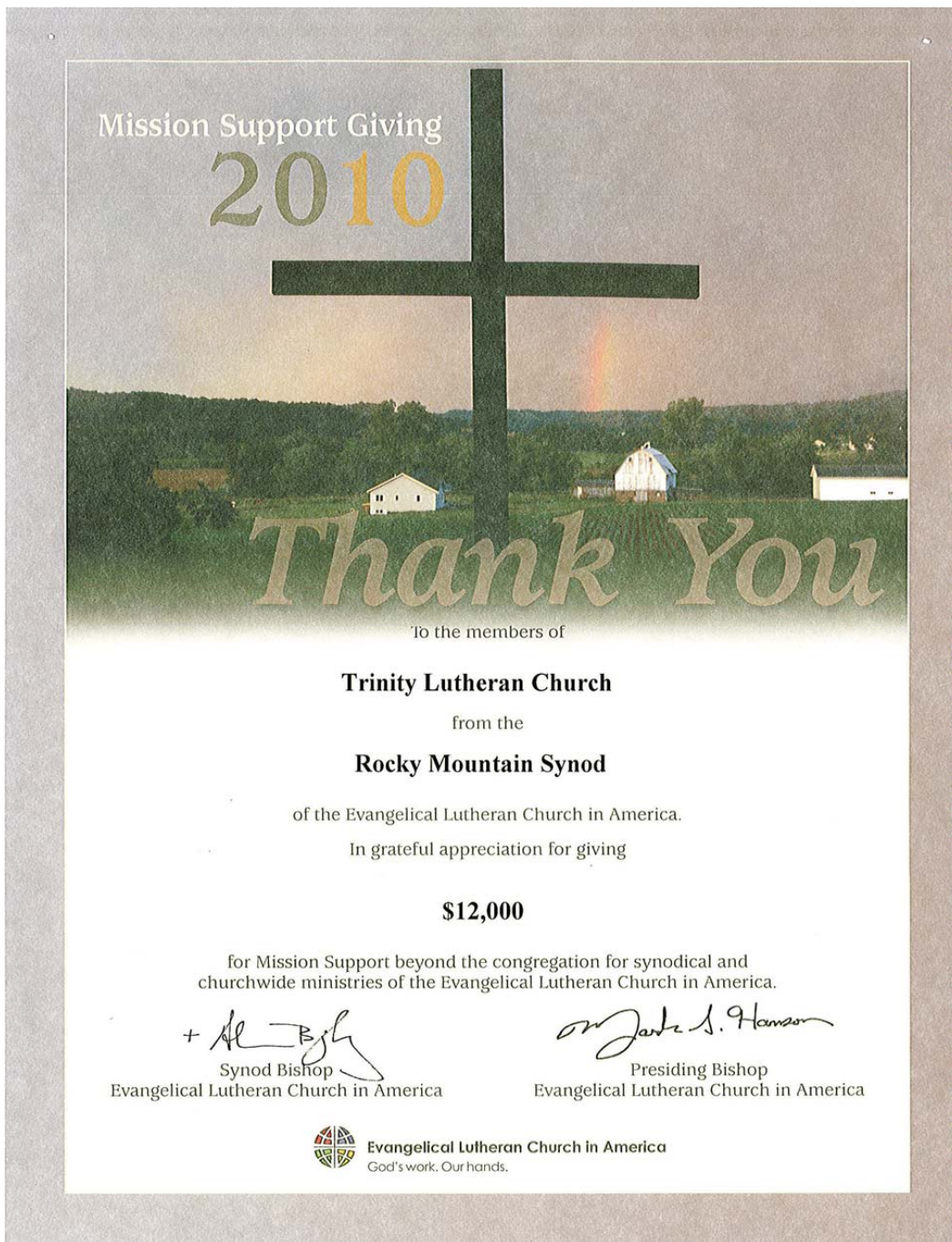

## Report on the Synod Assembly

The 2011 ELCA synod conference was inspirational. This year's theme was "Our Daily Bread", and expanding that theme to every aspect of our lives through fellowship, stewardship and sustainability. The daily feeding of our spiritual and physical lives. There were representatives, from Wyoming, New Mexico, Colorado, very North Texas, and Utah.

The conference was opened with an inspirational and energizing worship service. We baptized a new ELCA congregation into Rocky Mountain ELCA synod family, using the same words of baptism to support them in their growth with Christ, as we do when we baptize a child in to the body of Christ. The key note speaker Dr. Barbara Rossing, from the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago was enjoyable, entertaining and thought provoking. Her books are a must for reading!

Pastor Joseph Lauvanus from the Haiti ELCA, (they have 12 congregations in Haiti) spoke to us about the help received through the Lutheran organizations, both in money and manpower after the earthquake, that has been sustainable, allowing the Haitian people recovery, growth and stability.

The Assembly passed resolutions, to stop and prevent bullying, violence in both our families and society; to support Military Families, both active, discharged and retired. Also, we passed a resolution that encourages Lutheran congregations to read the Kairos Document written by Palestinian Christians. The document includes stories and testimonies of Christians living in the midst of conflict in Palestine.

And I HAVE to mention the music through the whole weekend rivaled any Heavenly choir! ( I guess Grandma was right, we Lutherans have the best music!)

For me the most amazing and inspiring was the youth of the ELCA. They are the future of our church and the world. Their enthusiasm, and the goals they have set and the milestones they have achieved are awe inspiring. It was comforting to know we have such young leaders very involved in our organization, and it is my belief we need to support and encourage their enthusiasm and beliefs.

The final worship service included a panoramic view of Pikes Peak and the Rocky Mountains, which sent us all off with full and uplifted spirits.

It was a wonderful "feeding" conference, and I want to thank the congregation for giving us the opportunity to represent our congregation.

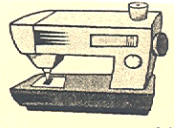

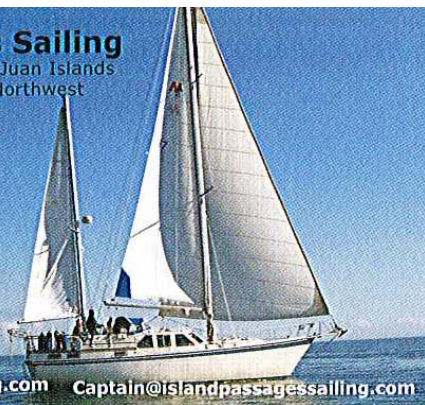

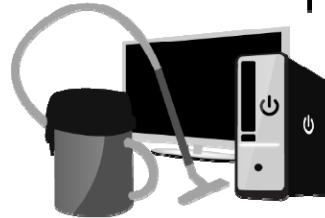
