All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.


- P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, † one God, who writes the law on our hearts, who draws all people together through Jesus.



A reading from Psalm 51



Whoever serves me, the Father will honor. ²⁷Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say — 'Father, save me from this hour'?
