on sabbatical, to whom shall we go?" Some helpful suggestions are below.

**Note: Pastor Kathy Gauger is no longer able to help with sabbatical coverage, but council exec has hired Pastor Rich Fennig as "Bridge Pastor for Sabbatical Coverage". Remember, Deacon Katie is still half-time and cannot take on my workload and her own during the leave.

Email: During sabbatical leave I will not be answering email and will not respond to any messages received during the leave. Please email the office, Bridge Pastor, or one of the volunteers.

Pastoral Care and Visitation: The Bridge Pastor will help in the office, with worship, and pastoral care (acute needs), on a limited basis. Additionally, our care team for visitation will be utilized for our shut-ins. If you desire a visit, in the hospital, or recovering, please call the church and we they will connect you.

Funerals: The Bridge Pastor (or if available and willing Deacon Katie) will lead any funerals. This is a hard boundary to set, but for both the congregation and myself, I will not be coming off sabbatical for any funerals. I will reconnect with the families after returning from leave.

Preaching/Presiding: An array of preachers will be preaching through the sabbatical leave.

Deacon Katie and The Bridge Pastor will preside most weekends unless the guest preacher is ordained and willing to preside. (The Bridge Pastor will conduct any baptisms that may be scheduled.) *As part of the sabbatical proposal and for her regular preaching days, we asked the synod permission for Deacon Katie to preside at communion, which has been granted! As of Jan 31, she has been extended licensure to preside at Trinity Lutheran Church, by Bishop Jim Gonia, for specific times in 2024. This gift helps Trinity provide Word and Sacrament ministry, especially for Saturday worship services when Pastor Rick or another pastor, cannot be present.*

Worship: Deacon Katie and the Bridge Pastor will not be available in worship every week, but council and music staff will be around to help host. The congregation is also expected to greet and welcome our guests, and show our gift of hospitality.

Bible Study (April and May): Kerrie Anderson of Mary of Magdala as volunteered to lead this group.

Adult Forum/Confirmation: Deacon Katie and Paul Johnson coordinate these education opportunities.

Committees and Council: Deacon Katie will be the clergy presence on council, and our capable leaders will lead the committees of which I am part.

Co Op (301 Faith Partner Cooperation): Deacon Katie will be the clergy representative for this team.

Staff Oversight: Deacon Katie and the Bridge Pastor will work with our staff (who are amazing!). Please utilize our office and music staff as much as possible during the sabbatical leave.

TLC Preschool Chapel: Deacon Katie in her allotted hours each week (Monday morning through May).

Small Groups: Deacon Katie and other staff (Amanda & Deana), will coordinate small groups and planning for next year.

Sabbatical is an opportunity for Trinity to rely on one another more, build our volunteer pool, and grow our relationships. God has given us a wide variety of resources around us during this leave, which is gift to our community. ~ Peace, Pastor Rick

Giving Again for Lent

The Social and Eco-Justice Team of the 301 Faith Partners thanks the congregation for its generous giving of food items during the Advent and Christmas season. Your response was overwhelming! The team is now asking you to extend your generosity during the season of Lent. Lent is the time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving (known as the Three Pillars of Lent in the Catholic tradition). We have put together another calendar for almsgiving and we're calling it the Left Hand of Lent Giving Calendar. It is based on the scripture of Mathew 6: 3-4, "But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret." There are forty nonperishable food items on the calendar for the forty days of Lent (not counting Sundays). As part of your Lenten discipline, simply add one item each day as you pray for those in need. At the end of Lent (or whatever is convenient for you), bring your items to church and place them in the southwest corner of the Fellowship Room. May the blessings of Lent be yours. 301 FP Joint Ecological Team (JET) ECO Tip of the Month

Hey green fingers, how green does your garden really grow? At the 301 Partner Garden we have successfully applied organic gardening techniques. We grow produce to give to the congregations and to the food bank when we can, all without using chemicals. Want to try a green garden? Here are some tips.

Keep it Real One of the most common mistakes that people make when starting out in organic pest control is thinking that organic pest control primarily means finding natural, organic alternatives to the pesticides they may have previously used. It is very important to remember that just because something is organic and natural, that does not necessarily mean that it is inert and harmless. Organic pesticides are free from synthetic chemicals—but they can still do a lot of harm if used with abandon and without great thought and care. Use physical pest deterrents instead and use compost instead of organic fertilizer.

Join us to grow the 301 Garden! Don't have a yard or think that a garden is too much for you and your family? You can still get in on the hoeing and growing action by showing up to help with the 301 Garden or joining a community garden in your area.

Harvest Rainwater Adding a rain barrel is an inexpensive and effortless way to capture mineral- and chlorine-free water for watering lawns, yards, and gardens. This can't replace a good soaker or drip irrigation hose, but it can cut down on the water that you use. Last year garden waterers found that high rains let us skip watering on some occasions. We harvest creek water for the garden and lawn to make our garden even more green.

Bring on the Butterflies and Bees and all the garden animals too! Herbs like oregano, dill and rosemary are great for pollinators, adding herbs is a great way to bring in the four b's. Bees, bats, birds, and butterflies can use your help. Offer them a pesticide free sanctuary for pollinators. Consider adding a section for native flowers. You'll enjoy having pollinators in your garden and beautiful flora to harvest for your table.

Creating a Paradise for Pollinators - Denver Urban Gardens (dug.org) Some "creepy crawly" beneficial animals for your garden

Bats - A little brown bat typically consumes half its body weight in insects every night. Insect-eating bats eat many moths whose caterpillars directly threaten gardens and crops.

Frogs, Toads, and Salamanders - Frogs and toads are carnivorous, feasting on beetles, slugs, crickets, flies, ants and other invertebrates. We're lucky to have Spring Creek nearby for great habitat for frogs, toads and salamanders as well as bats. Stop by in the evening to see what comes out to hunt. I'm planning to donate a bat house and a toad abode to the garden this year to hopefully attract these animals.

Ants and spiders – Weaver ants aerate soil and eat aphids. Spiders patrol gardens for flying and biting pests of all kinds!

One of the most important things to remember in any organic garden is that even pest species can be crucial parts of the garden ecosystem—with important roles to play in the local ecology. Seeking to eradicate them entirely does immense harm to the biodiversity and health of the ecosystem. Instead of trying to eradicate pests, we should instead be thinking about how to repel, confuse, distract, or redirect a particular species so that they do not decimate our crops or favorite plants.

The Joint Ecological Team meets as needed to plan educational events, bike to work day, volunteer opportunities and advocacy. Our next meeting is Tuesday, April 29 at 5:30 pm. Be sure to check out the JET table and bulletin board in the NW corner of the Fellowship Hall.

The synod includes Outdoor Ministries and Campus Ministries. The Campus Ministry is for university students who grew up in the Lutheran congregations. Synod is a Greek term, meaning "travel a common road."

Included in the group, are 159 congregations, 10 campus ministries, 3 outdoor ministries and the Office of the Bishop. Its mission: Together we proclaim and embody God's unconditional love for the sake of the world. The Rocky Mountain Synod is in region 2 and includes, Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, Wyoming, and Western Texas.

In 2024 the RMS Assembly will conduct an election for a new Bishop. This search for a new Bishop started in the Fall 2023 at Conference Gatherings and at the RMS Theological Conference. The election will conclude on April 24-27, 2024 with final balloting.
