

301 FP Joint Ecological Team (JET) ECO Tip of the Month

I once took the deputy superintendent of Yellowstone and the International President and CEO of the Michelin corporation on a tour of the Upper Geyser Basin. I have to admit that I was very aware of who he was but tried my best to give him the same educational tour that I gave to everyone (in spite of believing that Michelin's ground up tire path was leaching petrochemicals into the Firehole River). I remember that he sat down at Morning Glory as I talked about all the trash that had cooled the pool and caused it to forever change color. He turned to me, and he said in a very strong French accent, "this seems to me to be very overwhelming. How do you keep hope? Do you still have hope?" I answered that I always have hope and that hope motivates me. How do we remain hopeful while facing climate change head on? Just remember that small actions add up.

The endless energy and knowledge of young people, the resilience of nature and the human spirit, and faith in God, can give us hope. But what can one person do? One person can do a lot. Here are five...ok, six small steps to take that make a BIG impact on climate change.

- 1. Walk or bike somewhere you'd normally drive today. Walk or bike wherever and whenever possible to reduce emissions. Join the 301 Faith Partners and participate in "Bike to Work or Wherever day."
- 2. Climate change is causing an alarming loss of biodiversity including a decline in many pollinators. Plant native plants in a mini pollinator garden. Cultivate your garden without pesticides and fertilizers that can harm pollinators and run off into the rivers and streams. Ask local nurseries about native plants that work in Fort Collins and northern Colorado or look here. If you don't have a green thumb or space, join the 301 Faith Partners in the garden. This year we are planting mini pollinator gardens in addition to our normal vegetables.
- 3. Use *PLANTS* whenever possible. Eat them, use them to clean and use them in skincare. Did you know that many famous brand dish soaps, laundry detergents, body washes and lotions contain petroleum-based ingredients? These ingredients can pollute too. Ditch the petrochemical soaps and replace them with plant-based soaps. Buy formulas whenever possible, that come in cardboard. Did you know that you can buy hand soap in powder packets, laundry detergent and fabric softener in small sheets that go right into your washer, cleaners in small packets that you add water to make glass cleaner, all purpose cleaner, bathroom cleaner etc.? Buy as many things as possible without plastic containers. Contribute plant-based foods to the Little Pantry.
- 4.Live green but also live blue. Say no to single use plastics that pollute our rivers, streams and oceans. Water is life, make sure that the products you use are water friendly as part of the water web that surrounds us. Good examples are body scrubs that don't contain plastic beads and sunscreens that don't contain reef killing chemicals. Even polyester clothing pollutes water when it's washed. Try returning to natural fibers like wool and cotton. Is this issue important to you? Join the Social and Eco Justice team as they help the Snack Attack in their cleanup of Spring Creek!
- 5.Don't forget the Reduce part of Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. Buy less. Consume less. Reduce emissions from delivery of goods. Reduce energy consumption in your home...yeah, turning out lights when you leave the room, turning your heat down by 2 degrees and your cooling up by 2 degrees works. Thanks Mom! Passionate about this issue? Join the Property Team!
- 6. Choose one project or cause in your community and become involved. Join the Social and Eco Justice team to be part of your 301 Faith Partner community and take action to reduce climate change impacts or joint the Joint Ecological Team to work on environmental issues at the church. Other actions can help too...that's the premise behind Roots and Shoots, Jane Goodall's climate action group, one small action even one click actions can help. Tell your story about community involvement. Share it with friends at church. Create positive ripples in your community. Climate change is no match for the human spirit.

The Joint Ecological Team meets as needed to plan educational events, bike to work day, volunteer opportunities and advocacy. Our next meeting is **Tuesday, April 30 at 5:30 pm**. Be sure to check out the JET table and bulletin board in the NW corner of the Fellowship Hall. Please email any suggestions for future Eco-Tips to the Trinity church office.

Ways to Give at Trinity

Become a Realm giver! Call the office to get an invite to REALM, our new giving platform. In Realm you can donate from a checking account, savings account or your credit card. Donations can be done weekly, monthly, or annually. Also, you can look at the history of your giving and even print a statement for your taxes. Check it out!

For **One-Time Donations** go to <u>www.trinitylutheranfc.org</u> and click on "Give" at the top of the webpage. Find One-time Donation and follow the prompts from there. Again, you can have the donation come from a checking account, savings account or your credit card.

Are **charitable rollovers** an option for you? If you are required to take a minimum distribution from your IRA, you might be able have the check payable to Trinity, and not pay taxes on the distribution (please check with your tax advisor, or financial institution). The same applies if you have a charitable donor advised fund. Check with your financial institution on the frequency that works best for you.

Does your bank offer their customers a **bill paying option**? You can check with your bank about this. Some banks do not charge for this convenience. Have **automatic deductions** from your checking or savings account, done weekly, bi-monthly, or monthly.

Have the Venmo app? Trinity is also on Venmo! We are "Trinity-LutheranFC".

Use Regular Offering Envelopes-either brought to worship or mailed in.


Your Gifts In Action ~ Climate Change and Water

The Fort Collins non-profit organization **Trees, Water & People** (TWP) https://treeswaterpeople.org/ has been doing transformative work on behalf of communities in the U.S. and Central America and continues to receive Trinity's benevolence support. Their mission is to improve lives by helping communities to protect, conserve and manage natural resources on which their long-term well-being depends. They have five community-centered priorities: Dignified Livelihoods, Environmental Stewardship, Gender Equity & Inclusion, Indigenous Sovereignty and Youth Development. These all feed into their vision of a world where climate justice, equitable economic development and resilient communities are valued and have the space to thrive.

Lutherans Restoring Creation (LRC) https://lutheransrestoringcreation.org/ is a grassroots movement of Lutherans, driven by laity, pastors, lay professionals, synod leadership, and others who hold positions in the ELCA and its institutions. LRC's mission is to promote care for creation in the ELCA. They accomplish this by "cultivating a community of dedicated stewards of earth and neighbor who proclaim God's promise of hope and healing for all." LRC offers a full calendar of virtual and live events along with videos, book recommendations, blogs, writings, devotions, toolkits, downloads and online worship. They encourage congregations and individuals to be active participants in policy making, legislative processes, community engagement and ecological events locally, regionally, and globally.

This benevolence support in countries around the globe helps to meet a variety of water needs such as: hygiene kits, water filters, latrines, safe water wells, and irrigation system projects.
